\$30,000 GRANT RECEIVED

Sister Therese Antone, Vice President for Institutional Advancement was notified this past week that the College had received a \$30,000 Rhode Island Foundation Grant.

This grant will be used to help fund the ongoing renovation of Wakehurst.
