Last year 57,221 Aquidneck Island residents were served by United Way Agencies and \$683,692 were expended by the United Way in providing services.

This year, 1980, is the first time for an \$11 million dollar goal. It will provide \$100,000 for the admission of new agencies and programs deemed a priority by volunteers. It will allow for \$85,000 of special funding for the linguistically and culturally isolated – a United Way commitment made last year to the Hispanic community; and for special opportunities and needs that occur throughout the year.

More than 91 cents of every dollar contributed to the United Way goes directly to human service agencies, which have total annual budgets of more than \$35,000,000 The United Way is by far one of the most effective ways to provide needed human service to the people of our community.
