FOURTH ANNUAL GOVERNOR'S BALL

A highlight of the Christmas season celebration in Newport for the fourth year in a row is the now traditional Salve Regina College Governor's Ball. Approximately 400 guests are expected to attend the gala event to be held Saturday, December 6 from 9:00 p.m. to 1:00 a.m. in Ochre Court.

This year the Kentish Guards will form an honor guard as guests enter the French chateau's Great Hall to be greeted by College President Sister Lucille McKillop, Governor and Mrs. J. Joseph Garrahy, honorary chairmen, and Mr. and Mrs. Albert N. D'Amico, general chairmen.

The theme for this year's Ball is the Year of the French. Flowers accented with the fleur de lis, a dominant theme in the building's decor, will emphasize this theme. Tables, draped with white cloth, will be decorated with mirrored bases to reflect the red, white and blue floral arrangements accented with miniature American and French flags.
