Please be sure to seek the assistance of your faculty advisor prior to registering. Students planning to graduate in May, 1981 should complete the File for Degree Form enclosed in your packet. Please be advised that Spring 1981 course booklets have been mailed. If you have not received your booklet by your registration date, please pick one up at the College Resource Center in the O'Hare Lobby.

Attention Freshmen! Spring Registration/Advising Procedure:

1. You should receive your registration packet no later than Monday, December 15, 1980. (If you have not received your material by then, pick it up at the College Resource Center and check the College's current listing of your local address -- Registrar's Office.)
2. Make arrangements to see your academic advisor before Thursday, December 18, 1980.

3. With your advisor select the appropriate Math, English, Major Course(s) and Elective(s). Discuss your transition into a department at the College.
4. Fill out the registration form completely and be sure to have your advisor sign the bottom of the form. (Freshmen registrations will not be accepted without the signature of the advisor.)
5. Bring your form to the registrar's desk in the O'Hare Lobby on Thursday, December 18, 1980 from 9:00 a.m. - 11:30 a.m. or from 1:00 p.m. - 3:30 p.m.

NOTE: Junior year students who have already borrowed the maximum GSL will now be able to borrow an additional \$2500, (3000 for independent) in their senior year.

The PSYCHOLOGY DEPARTMENT would like the College Community to know well in advance that on January 7, 1981 (the first Wednesday after the Christmas recess) it will be showing the remarkable flim THE WILD CHILD. This film is a French film produced in 1970 by Francois Truffaut and is a dramatization of the story THE WILD BOY OF AVEYRON written by Dr. E.M. Itard in 1801. This true story is the account of his finding and attempting to educate a young boy, a so-called "feral Child", who had been living apparently for years in animal-like fashion in the woods of France. This touchingly beautiful story dramatically illustrates the frustrations and tender triumphs Itard experienced in educating a child who to him, and to others, was the personification of Rousseau's "Noble Savage," untainted by the corruption of society. Itard's work was ultimately to influence the work of Maria Montessori through her teacher, Edouard Seguin, Itard's pupil and friend. SAFETY TIPS

Suggestions on ways to cut THEFTS during the HOLIDAYS:

1. Packages left in parked cars should be locked in the trunk.
2. Parked autos should be locked when unattended, especially in large parking lots, such as shopping centers. Keys should not be left in the ignition.
3. Persons carrying a purse are reminded not to carry large amounts of money in the purse.
4. Wallets and credit cards should be kept on the person and in an inside pocket.
5. If an attacker grabs a purse, it should be let go so as not to risk injury. The opening of the pocketbook should be turned toward the person carrying it, not out where it could be opened in a crowd.
6. THEFT rises sharply during December, do not become a victim through CARELESSNESS.
