CONGRATULATIONS SENATOR MCKENNA!!!

The entire College Community extends sincere congratulations to Senator McKenna for the important responsibility he has just received from the President of the United States. Senator Robert J. McKenna, Director of College and Community Relations, has been asked by President Carter to serve on a 12-member National Commission on Student Financial Assistance. Senator McKenna was one of four appointees selected from throughout the country by the President. Also on the 12-member panel are two U.S. Senators and two U.S. Representatives, one from each party. One of the United States Senators, Senator Claiborne Pell, was named to the National Commission by Senate Majority Leader Robert Ryrd. Four other members were chosen, two by the President of the U.S. Senate and two by the Speaker of the House. The members of the panel will serve until July 1, 1983 and will study all aspects of student assistance. President Carter will appoint one of his four nominees to serve as chairman of the commission. Congress has authorized an appropriation of \$10,000,000 to be used for this study. Once again we are proud that a member of the College administration and faculty was asked to serve on a National Higher Education Commission.
