SISTERS OF MERCY ONE HUNDRED FIFTIETH ANNIVERSARY

The Institute of the Religious Sisters of Mercy was founded in Dublin, Ireland December 12, 1831, by Catherine Elizabeth McAuley. One of her life long desires was to extend the Mercy Mission to the United States. Mother McAuley died before this wish became a reality. Two years after her death, Mother Francis Xavier Warde carried out her foundress' dream. In 1843 Mother Xavier Warde established the first foundation of the Sisters of Mercy in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania.

On March 11, 1851 at the invitation of Right Reverend Bernard O'Reilly, D.D., Bishop of Hartford, Mother Xavier Warde established a Convent and School in Providence, Rhode Island. At that time the State of Rhode Island was in the Hartford diocese. The first liturgy was celebrated at the Convent the next morning, March 12, 1851, and this day has since been kept by the Sisters of Mercy of the Province of Providence as their Foundation Day.

Three years later at the invitation of Miss Emily Harper, a summer resident of Newport and a relative of the American Patriot, Charles Carroll, Mother Xavier Warde arrived on Aquidneck Island with several sisters and they opened St. Mary's Convent on Spring Street.

In this one hundred fiftieth anniversary year of the foundation of the Institute of the Religious Sisters of Mercy, the Sisters at the College have chosen their Rhode Island Foundation Day as their day of celebration with the entire Salve Regina Community. The Sisters look forward to sharing this joyous occasion with the College Community at a special Mass in the Ochre Court Chapel at 6:45 a.m., Thursday, March 12. Mass will be followed by a continental breakfast in the state dining room for all guests.
