ANNUAL COMPETITION FOR OVERSEAS STUDY

The Institute for International Education has announced that the official opening of the 1982-83 competition for grants for graduate study or research abroad in academic fields and for professional training in the creative and performing arts is scheduled for May 1, 1981. It is expected that approximately 516 awards to 50 countries will be available for the 1982-83 academic year.

Requirements:

1. Bachelor's Degree or its equivalent before beginning date of grant.
2. U.S. citizen
3. Proficiency in language of host country
4. Candidates may not hold Ph.D.
5. Candidates may not have been doing research or graduate work in the grant request foreign country during the 1981-82 academic year.
