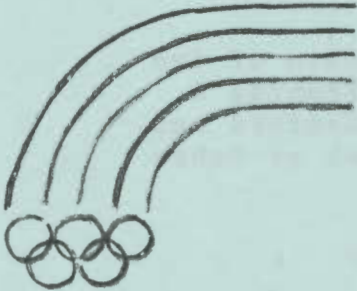

Three students and two faculty members from Salve ran in the Mini-Marathon last Sunday, May 3rd.

Anne Sheehan and Eileen Burke finished the windy, hilly 10-mile course in 80:39 and 80:40, respectively. They placed 9th and 10th in the women's division. Clare Auerbach came in 17 seconds later at 80:57, placing 11th. Sheehan, Burke and Auerbach placed 93rd, 94th and 96th overall.

John Rok was right behind the students, placing 101 overall with a time of 82:00.

Dr. John Greeley ran an excellent race, coming in 64th overall with a time of 73:54. Greeley won a trophy for placing 3rd in the master's division.
