CONGRATULATIONS!!!!!!

The entire College community wishes to extend a very warm and heartfelt congratulations to Dr. Mary Louise Ide and Dr. John Greeley on the occasion of their marriage. John and Mary Louise were married last Friday, at St. Mary's Church, Spring Street.

Dr. Robert J. McKenna has been elected vice chairman of the New England Board of Higher Education. The board develops and administers cooperative programs among New England's 261 colleges and universities, and serves as an information resource for the region's academic community, government, business, industry and labor. Dr. McKenna has served as a delegate to the New England Board of Higher Education for four years.

Recently the chemistry department, under the direction of Dr. Ascanio Di Pippo, conducted a tour and performed experiments for the fourth grade class of Aquidneck School.
