FACULTY NEWS - CONGRATULATIONS SISTER THERESE, SISTER THERESA,
AND BROTHER VICTOR!!

Sister M. Therese Antone, Vice President for Institutional Advancement, will receive a Doctor of Education degree from Harvard University on Thursday, June 4, 1981. It will be Harvard's three hundred and thirtieth commencement. Congratulations Sister Therese.

At its final meeting for the 1980-81 current school year the Rhode Island Association of Colleges for Teacher Education (RIACTE) elected Brother Victor Hickey, FSC, President of the Association. This association is the state's official branch of the American Association of Colleges for Teacher Education (AACTE). Member associations of RIACTE are: Barrington College, Brown University, Bryant College, The Newport College - Salve Regina, Providence College, Rhode Island College, Roger Williams College, and University of Rhode Island. As President of the state Association, Br. Victor Hickey will be the state's official representative to the annual meeting of the American Association of Colleges for Teacher Education. The office is held for a three year term.

At the May 18th meeting of the Alliance Francais of Newport, held at the Historical Society, Sister Theresa McQueeney was requested to serve on the organization's by-law revision committee.

Sister also attended the annual dinner meeting of the American Association of Teachers of French and the R.I. Foreign Language Association, held at U.R.I., on May 20th. Topics discussed included the forthcoming International Colloquium at Cap Rouge, Quebec; degree requirements in modern languages/international studies at U.R.I. and other state universities, as of the Fall Semester '81; U.S./Quebec student exchange, organized by the New England Federation of Colleges and Universities; and the N.E. French Colloquium to be held at Assumption College, in October.

SALVE CONTEST WINNER

Sister M. Therese Antone was recently informed by Mr. Normand L. Vaillancourt, coordinator of The Old Stone Bank Educational Foundation, that Salve's entry "The New Astronomy" had been awarded a restricted grant of \$4,300. These moneys will fund the project. The project will be offered to K-12 Science Teachers, from September 2 - December 16, 1981. Old Stone Bank sponsors an annual contest for innovative programs. This year 37 proposals were received. A brochure entitled "The New Astronomy" which describes the program will be available next week. Brother Victor Hickey, Chairman of the Education Department, will administer this program.
