SALVE ELECTS THREE TRUSTEES

Salve Regina College, Newport, Rhode Island, announces the appointment of three new members to its Board of Trustees. The new Board members are: Mr. Joseph E. Fernandes of Norton, Massachusetts; Sister Mary Rosalia Flaherty, R.S.M., of Pawtucket, Rhode Island; and Capt. Carl A. Auel, U.S.N., of Pensacola, Florida.

Mr. Fernandes is Chairman of the Board and Treasurer of Fernandes Supermarkets, Inc., a southeastern Massachusetts chain of 32 supermarkets employing over 2,500 people. He is also Treasurer of the Fernandes Realty Corporation, the East Shopping Plaza, Inc., and Fernandes Twin-City Realty Corporation.

A member of the Board of Directors of the Massachusetts Retail Grocers Association and vice president of the Supermarket Management Association of Massachusetts, Fernandes is a former president of the International Association of Chain Stores, a group of 120,000 stores from 26 countries headquartered in Paris. He is a director of the United National Bank, Taunton, Mass.; a director of Massachusetts Blue Shield; and a director of Fall River Line, Pier, Inc.

In 1964, Mr. Fernandes received the "Man of the Year" award from the National Conference of Christians and Jews. He was

also the recipient of the 6th Annual "Peter Francisco" award whose previous recipients were President John F. Kennedy and John dos Passos.

A graduate of Boston University College of Business Administration, Mr. Fernades holds an Honorary Doctor of Commercial Sciences from Stonehill College, North Easton, Massachusetts. He is a former member of the Board of Visitors at Boston University, a member of the President's Council at Wheaton College, Norton, Massachusetts; a director of the Bishop Feehan High School Corporation; a former member of the Board of Directors at St. Joseph's College, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania; and he is currently chairman of the Board of Trustees at Stonehill College.

Captain Auel is a Chaplain with the United States Navy currently stationed in Pensacola, Florida. He has served as Director of the U.S. Naval Chaplain School and with the Chief of Chaplains Office, Washington D.C. An eighteen year veteran of the Navy Chaplain Corps., Captain Auel served in Europe and Southeast Asia where he was chaplain to the Marine Corps., in South Vietnam.

He has a Bachelor's Degree from Capital University in Columbus, Ohio; a degree from the Lutheran Theological Seminary; and Union Theological Seminary; and a Master of Education and a Doctor of Education from Boston University. While at Boston University, Captain Auel served as the Dean of Continuing Education at Salve Regina College. For his service to the college,

Salve awarded him an Honorary Doctorate.

Sister Mary Rosalia Flaherty, R.S.M., is currently Director of Development and Public Relations at St. Xavier's Academy in Providence. She is also a Consultant for Non-Public Schools to the Rhode Island State Department of Education.

She is a member of the Corporation of Salve Regina College, the Corporation of St. Xavier Academy, and the Rhode Island Association for Supervision and Development. She has also served as a member of the Board of Trustees at Mount Saint Agnes College, Baltimore, Maryland; Administrator at the Pine Harbor Home and School for Mentally Retarded Children, Pascoag, Rhode Island; and Academic Dean at Salve Regina College.

Sister Flaherty holds a B.A. from Salve Regina, a B.S. from Catholic Teachers College; and a M.A. and a Ph.D. from Catholic University of America.
