DR. SHEILA MEGLEY, R.S.M., APPOINTED PROVOST

Sister Lucille McKillop, R.S.M., President of Salve Regina - The Newport College, is pleased to announce the appointment of Dr. Sheila Megley, R.S.M. as Provost.

As Provost, Dr. Megley will serve as the Vice President authorized to officiate over all College business in the absence of the President. Sister Sheila Megley will continue to hold her title as Vice President/Academic Dean, a position she has held since 1978. In her capacity as Vice President/Academic Dean, Dr. Megley continues to be responsible for Curriculum and Instruction, Faculty Development, and virtually all student service areas. She has also coordinated the self-evaluation process for the College's ongoing accreditations of its Nursing Program, Teacher Education Program, Special Education Program, and, most recently, the 1980 Institutional Re-evaluation Visit by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges.

In addition to her College related duties, Sister Sheila Megley currently chairs the Executive Board of the Mercy Higher Education Colloquium (a representative group of nineteen colleges across the United States sponsored by the Religious Sisters of Mercy); has served as Chairperson of the Equal Education Opportunity Task Force for Rhode Island (by appointment of the Governor); has served on Committees for the Study of Women in Higher Education of the American Council on Education; has served as Chairperson of Programs for the Association of Deans of Private Colleges in Rhode Island; has served on Evaluation Teams of the New England Association of Schools and Colleges.

Dr. Megley joined the Salve Regina College community in 1974 as Dean of Students. She holds a Ph.D in English from the University of Nebraska, a Master of Arts degree in English from the University of Chicago, a Master of Arts degree in Theology from St. Xavier College and a Bachelor's degree in Mathematics from Rosary College. Regina - The Newport College includes teaching at the grade school, high school, and college level, as well as administrative experience at the college level.

SALVE REGINA CHOSEN TO HOUSE RARE COLLECTION OF BONE PATHOLOGY

O'Hare Academic Center has been chosen as the site to house a rare collection of the life's work of famous bone pathologist Henry L. Jaffe. Dedication of the Henry L. Jaffe Bone Pathology Collection was held July 22 at Salve.

Dr. Henry Louis Jaffe is considered the nation's leading pathologist in the field of bone tumors. The collection of his life's research -- clinical histories, slides, X-rays, articles and reprints -- was moved to the basement of his home in Pelham, New York, after his death in January, 1979. Many felt it had been lost to the field of science.

Dr. Jaffe's widow learned of a refresher course, "Basic Sciences in Orthopaedics," taught each summer at Salve Regina College for over 100 Orthopaedic surgeons from hospitals in the U.S. and Canada. Sponsored by the Harvard Combined Orthopaedic Residency Program Faculty, the course has been held on the Newport Campus since 1979. With the placement of her husband's work at Salve, Mrs. Jaffe felt the rare collection could be used year-round: in the summer by orthopaedic surgeons and during the academic year by Salve students, especially medical technology majors. Through her son, Dr. Arthur Jaffe of the Lyman Physics Laboratory in Cambridge, Mrs. Jaffe offered the collection to Dr. Henry J.Mankin, Edith Ashley professor of orthopaedic surgery at Harvard and chief of orthopaedic surgery at Massachusetts General Hospital. Dr. Mankin, organizer of the summer course for surgeons, was delighted to move the collection to Salve in Newport.

The Jaffe Collection was dedicated during the workshop for orthopaedic surgeons, held annually for the past three years at Salve. "Basic Sciences in Orthopaedics" is a course offering over 100 orthopaedic surgeons from the U.S. and Canada an opportunity to review the anatomy, physiology and pathology that undergirds their specialty. Other surgeons have begun to donate material from their own collections to the Jaffe research. Curators hope that in the next 10 years this collection will become the nucleus of a first-class study center at Salve Regina college.

Each hall director is responsible for coordinating educational, cultural and social programs, being a resource person and liaison to resident assistants, desk workers and students and ensuring a residential atmosphere conducive to studying.

Carrie Lou is a graduate of Roger Williams College, Bristol, R.I., with a bachelor of arts degree in psychology. She worked previously as a psychology assistant at Roger Williams College, and as a research planner for Self Help, Inc., Riverside, R.I., assisting to develop the educational opportunities of East Bay area's low income population. She is a native of Manchester, Conn.

Frederick, a native of Barrington, is a graduate of the University of Rhode Island with a bachelor of science degree in animal science. He previously worked in the office of residential life at URI.

Sue graduated from Yale with a bachelor of arts degree in psychology. A native of North Haven, Conn., her previous work experience has been in a psychology-related area in hospitals.

PILOT PROGRAM SHARPENS WRITING AND VERBAL SKILLS

A pilot project is being sponsored jointly by the College, Martin Luther King Center and the Rhode Island Educational Opportunity Center to help upgrade skills of people who want to further their education. Fifteen Newporters are enrolled. The project was made possible by \$1,000 donation from the city of Newport.

The College is providing the instructor, in the person of Sister Consilii Reynolds, the curriculum and credit for successful completion of the program, the King Center has volunteered classroom space, and Leslie Elston, counselor with the educational opportunity center, is recruiting the students. The project right now has a waiting list.
