FACULTY NEWS

MINDPOWER CAMPAIGN

Salve Regina College is continuing to participate with other Rhode Island colleges and universities in generating visibility and support for higher education. During this month several leading college administrators and educators are appearing on radio and television talk shows to discuss often debated issues in higher education.

This Sunday, October 18, at 6:30 am and 10:05 pm, Salve's Sister Sheila Megley, Vice President/Academic Dean, will be a guest on the WOTB FM-107 radio show, "Coastline". Joining Sister Sheila is Dr. Bill Ferrante, Vice President for Academic Affairs at the University of Rhode Island. Sister Sheila and Dr. Ferrante will discuss several key issues including reduced federal aid for students and research, college board scores, academic vs. athletic budgets, and changes in public vs. private college recruiting programs.

Sister Loretto O'Connor has spent the last two years as a scholar in residence. In that capacity, she has researched and presented in modern version an anthology of the prose of medieval England (1100-1485), taken from the three languages in which it was written - Latin, French and the several dialects of Middle English. The title of the soon to be published anthology is: Shared Harvest: Prose of Medieval England in Modern Version. The book will be published by the University Press of America, and is scheduled for marketing by mid-December, 1981. The text, a "first" of its kind, shares with the reader a harvest of long, neglected prose: chronicles with their medieval "journalism," geography, history (fictitious and otherwise); narrative prose in the forms of tales, legends, folklore, etc.

Another first will be The Disputed Questions of Alexander of Hales. The excerpts of this work to appear in the anthology were translated from the Medieval Latin by Dr. Lubomir Gleiman. This is the first time that this excerpt from Alexander of Hales has ever been translated into English. The excerpts were obtained from the Franciscan Research Center in Italy. It took Sister Loretto two years to find this particular piece of Medieval Latin prose.
