DANCING BECOMES MARATHON SPORT AT SALVE REGINA THIS WEEKEND

This Friday evening at 7 pm, memorable as Friday the 13th, the dance marathon, pitting physical endurance against shrewd strategy (or more succinctly, brawn against brains) begins for approximately 30 couples who are pledge dancing for the American Cancer Society. Twenty hours later, at 3 pm on Saturday, leg-weary couples will stop.

The unique guidelines for contestants are as follows: All contestants must solicit pledges (minimum pledge, 10 cents) for each hour they dance. "Dancing" is defined as having both feet continuously moving at the same time, and it must proceed for 75 minutes wherein a 15-minute break will take place. Contestants will be served meals three times during the contest; the break will then be extended to 30 minutes.

The winners of the 20-hour event, according to Norman Faria, Director of College Activities, will be determined by the greatest number of pledges received, combined, of course, with the total number of hours danced.
