Touro Synagogue's <u>Rabbi Theodore Lewis</u> and <u>Joseph Caufield</u> are the scheduled guests for the upcoming "Education Via Radio" program, Wednesday, November 25.

Rabbi Lewis is a native of Dublin, Ireland, graduating from Trinity College there. He is also an honorary degree recipient from Salve Regina. Joe is a senior majoring in history and theatre.

Historical Newporters to be discussed include Moses Seixas, one-time rabbi of Touro Synagogue, the oldest synagogue in North America and an historical landmark. Seixas is distinguished for the famous "Washington letter."

Abraham and Isaac Touro, for whom the synagogue is named, were wealthy, influential individuals who helped finance the American Revolution.
