COMMEMORATIVE BOOKLET FOR SALVE REGINA COLLEGE GOVERNOR'S BALL OFFERS GLIMPSE OF GILDED AGE ARCHITECTURE/TRADITIONS

"Glimpses of Ochre Court" during America's Gilded Age is the theme of a unique, 12-page commemorative booklet for guests attending the Salve Regina College Governor's Ball December 5.

The traditional fifth year anniversary symbol is wood. Presented in the booklet to mark this occasion for the guests of the Ball are several photos and explanations of wood carvings that appear in Ochre Court's second floor arches. Booklet researchers discovered the year these were done (1890) and the sculptors' initials among the art. The company's name was traced to that of Ellin, Kitson & Co., architectural sculptors and stonecutters, of New York.

The booklet also offers a glimpse of Ochre Court architecture as conceived by the famous American architect, Richard Morris Hunt. An unusual print of the interior of Hunt's studio in Newport in 1890 (now demolished) and Hunt's architectural rendering of Ochre Court highlight this unique publication.

Assisting in the preparation have been numerous individuals and organizations including the American Institute of Architects Foundation, Newport Historical Society, Redwood Library and Athenaeum, Rhode Island Historical Society, New York Public Library, and Newport and Providence Public Libraries.

#### FACULTY NOTES

Judith A. Gifford, Serials Librarian, has recently completed the seven week course on geneological research techniques and sources which was sponsored by the Rhode Island Historical Society and held at its library in Providence.

Presented by Alden C. Saunders, specialist in Rhode Island geneology and certified American lineage specialist, the course concentrated on, but was not limited to, those resources readily available to Rhode Islanders, including vital records, census materials, church records, resources in the state and national archives collections, etc. In addition to indicating the various sources of geneological data, participants were introduced to basic methods for their use and provided with suggested forms and formulas for abstracting lineage. Such documentation would be of utmost importance should the researcher seek to have a line accepted by an historical organization such as the Society for Mayflower Descendants, Colonial Dames of America, Sons of the American Revolution, and other organizations.

Barbara S. Dean, Assistant Professor, Department of Nursing, spoke recently to a group of registered nurses on the Concept of Change at Charlton Memorial Hospital in Fall River. The presentation, sponsored by the Department of Education of the hospital focused on the meaning of change, the change process and the role of the professional nurse as a change agent. Those present were awarded CEU's approved by Massachusetts Nurses' Association.

Jill Stephens Hastings, Judith Gifford and Sr. M. Mauricita Stapleton attended the Rhode Island Library Association Annual Fall Conference held recently at the Sheraton Islander. Among the professional topics of concern were use of microcomputers for library procedures, interlibrary loan services and problems, legislation for library and information services in the state
