TIMELY LECTURE TO COMMUNITY**

Continuing its effort to bring speakers of note in various fields to interested students and Rhode Islanders, Salve Regina College will present Dr. Gerhart H. Seger, noted author, newspaper correspondent and lecturer, on Tuesday evening, January 14 at 7:30 p.m. in the Great Hall of Ochre Court. Dr. Seger will lecture on "United States-Berlin Relations Today."

Dr. Seger, a graduate of the School of Journalism at the University of Leipzig in Germany, has worked as a newspaperman in Germany and as a foreign correspondent in most European capitals.

While serving on the Committee on Foreign Relations of the German Reichstag (national legislature), Dr. Seger was arrested by the Nazis and held in the first concentration camp. He escaped to Czechoslovakia and later emigrated to the United States and became a citizen in 1942.

During World War II, Dr. Seger worked with the U.S. armed services in various capacities. He served as a witness at the first Nuremburg trial and also has toured extensively Lebanon, Syria, Jordan, Israel and other countries which are making headlines daily in the news.

Dr. Seger is an American Public Relations Consultant to the German Information Center in New York City. He is also U. S. Correspondent of the West Berlin newspaper "Telegraf".

Among his writings are Oranienburg, about his concentration camp experiences; Diary of A Refugee; Life in Germany, a school textbook; Dictatorship-War-Disaster, a history of Nazi Power, and U.S.A., published in Munich, 1958.

Dr. Seger is speaking at Salve Regina College through the cooperation of the Rhode Island Council of World Affairs. His lecture is open to the public, free.
