ATWOOD LECTURE SERIES

The M. Atwood Lecture Series is sponsoring two upcoming lectures. This Lecture Series is being offered via Salve Regina's Department of Philosophy which was a recipient of a grant by Donaldson Trusts. Mrs. Atwood is a trustee of the Donaldson Foundation.

The first lecture, "Laughter in Hermes and Plato," is an investigation into laughter as it is used in the comic and tragic sense. It will be presented Thursday, March 25, by guest lecturer Charles Boer. Dr. Boer is a professor of English at the University of Connecticut, and is a translator of the "Homeric Hymns." He has also authored two books on Marsilio Ficino, a Renaissance humanist who founded the Platonic Academy in Florence, Italy. The lecture is at 8:00 pm in O'Hare auditorium tonight. It is free and the public is invited.
