ART ASSOCIATION, SALVE REGINA COLLEGE CO-SPONSOR "GREAT AMERICAN BOWL"
POTTERY EXHIBITION: 102 PIECES TO BE DISPLAYED

Eighty-eight potters representing 34 states will be displaying their works at "The Great American Bowl", a national exhibition running April 2-25 at the Art Association of Newport.

The combination juried and invitational event is co-sponsored by the Art Association of Newport and Salve Regina, and is the first of its kind to be held in Newport. Each work is to be the artist's visual statement of what a bowl is; 102 pieces will be exhibited. Artists' written statements will also accompany their works. The Art Association is open from 10:00 am to 5:00 pm Tuesday through Saturday and from 2:00 pm to 5:00 pm on Sunday.

In conjunction with this month-long exhibition, two workshops at the College are planned. On Wednesday, April 7, Mexican potters, Juan Quezada and Lydia Talavera will give a demonstration of their work in the Mercy Hall Ceramics Studio at Salve. They will be accompanied by anthropologist Spencer MacCallum, who will present a slide presentation on "The Potters of Palanganos". This informal workshop will begin at 9:30 am and is open to the public at no cost. The second workshop will be April 17 and 18. Registration is required to attend the second workshop. STATEWIDE CHILD ABUSE/NEGLECT CONFERENCE TO FOCUS ON STRATEGIES TO REDUCE NUMBER OF INCIDENTS

A statewide conference on the various aspects of child abuse and neglect will be held Saturday, April 3 from 9:00 am to 3:30 pm in O'Hare. The purpose of the conference, "Child Abuse and Neglect: Rhode Island Perspectives" is to promote individuals' understanding and awareness of how to deal with this tragic problem. During the course of the day, participants will collaborate with professionals in the fields of law, education, law enforcement and family and child protection to share experiences and insights and offer strategies in the struggle to reduce the magnitude of the problem.

SALVE SENIOR SELECTED TO READ PAPER AT ANNUAL CONFERENCE OF EASTERN PSYCHOLOGICAL ASSOCIATION

Fran L. Currant, a senior, has co-authored a psychological paper which she will present at the annual meeting of the Eastern Psychological Association April 14-17, in Baltimore. Fran, a psychology and education major, co-authored the paper with Dr. Arthur Frankel, associate professor of psychology. Dr. Frankel assisted Fran by rewriting the paper in the appropriate psychological format.

Dr. Frankel said it was very unusual for an undergraduate's paper to be selected for reading. Most papers selected, he said, are those completed by graduate students. The paper, "Expressive Movement and Personality: Signature Size as an Unobtrusive Measure of Self Esteem", is a basic study of how an individual's success or failure on tests can cause definite fluctuations in his/her signature size.

Sir Thomas Lipton, England's challenger for the America's Cup in the early 1900's, and Harold Vanderbilt, successful defender of the Cup in the 1930's, are the subjects of the upcoming "Education via Radio" program, Wednesday, April 7, on WADK, radio 1540.

Dr. Fred Alofsin, chairman of the Rhode Island State Yachting Committee, as well as coordinator of the America's Cup races, and Diane Martin, a senior, are the scheduled guests. They will discuss the significant yachting successes and failures of each man's life.
