1982 HONORS CONVOCATION

The Honorable Governor J. Joseph Garrahy will be present at the 1982 Honors Convocation Saturday, May 1 at Salve Regina - The Newport College.

Over 700 people are expected to attend the event, held annually to recognize and honor Salve students who have excelled in leadership, scholarship and service to others.

This year, approximately 150 students will receive awards from academic departments and College organizations, for outstanding scholarship, Who's Who Among Students, and Honor Society membership. In addition, college-wide service awards will be given to outstanding members of the freshman, sophomore, junior and senior classes.

This year's valedictory address will be presented by Mary Beth Cordeiro, a resident of Westport, Mass. Mary Beth, an elementary education major with a minor in psychology, achieved a grade point average of 3.99 out of a possible 4.0.

Sister Lucille McKillop will name the 1982 recipient of the Salve Scholarship. This scholarship is awarded annually to the sophomore or junior having the highest grade point average and covers full tuition costs for one year.

This year's Honors Convocation will be held on the terrace of Ochre Court. In case of inclement weather the Convocation will be held at Spruance Auditorium at the Naval War College.

ANNUAL COMPETITION FOR OVERSEAS STUDY

The Institute of International Education has announced that the official opening of the 1983-84 competition for grants for graduate study or research abroad in academic fields and for professional training in the creative and performing arts is scheduled for May 1, 1982. It is expected that approximately 500 awards to 50 countries will be available for the 1983-84 academic year.

Selection is based on the academic and/or professional record of the applicant, the validity and feasibility of the proposed study plan, the applicant's language preparation and personal qualifications.
