THIRD ANNUAL NEWPORT COUNTY OLYMPICS

The results of many months of planning, coordinating and dedicated work will be visible this Saturday, May 8, when the third Annual Newport County Olympics are held on the Salve campus at the new track facility. The Olympic Coordinating Committee reports that over 100 athletes have registered to participate; they will be assisted by nearly 200 volunteer students, faculty and staff from the College as well as volunteers from the James L. Maher Center, area school systems and the Publicity Committee reports that among the sports personalities expected to attend the event and assist in the awards ceremonies are Rick Vilella of the New England Patriots, Chris McDonald, a member of the 1980 U.S. Olympic Boxing Team, and Kevin Stacom, former basketball star at Providence College and with the Boston Celtics.

The Fund-Raising Committee has raffle tickets available this week in the lobby of O'Hare Academic Center; a 50¢ ticket offers a chance to win one of a dozen prizes with a total value of over \$250. Newport County Olympics booster buttons are also on sale for \$1.00; these were designed and created by children at Canton State Hospital/School. And Newport County Olympic balloons will fill the air again on Saturday with all proceeds from the sale of these balloons helping to provide the best Newport County Olympics yet.

TRACK

The first Annual Salve Regina Interscholastic Relay Carnival for Newport County High Schools was held on Saturday, May 1, 1982 on the college track at Wakehurst Gardens.

Ninety-two boys and girls representing four schools: Middletown High School, Portsmouth Abbey High School, Portsmouth High School, and Rogers High School competed in the eight events. Eighty of the competitors received medals, as members of teams scoring first, second, or third places.

The athletic department extends its congratulations to all who competed and its thanks to the Salve students, faculty and staff whose cooperation in the preparation of the track and running of the meet made this event successful.

SOFTBALL

The women's softball team bowed out after playing two games in the Rhode Island State tournament, losing to University of Rhode Island (the eventual state champions) and Roger Williams.

MEN'S VARSITY BASEBALL

The Salve baseball team split a doubleheader against Roger Williams on Friday. Salve won the first game 6-5 behind the hitting of Ken Findlay and Paul Fluegel. Roger Williams won the second game 8-0. Salve record is now 6-8.

SALVE BEATS BARRINGTON, 11-0

The Rhode Island Intercollegiate Baseball Tournament began its second year the same way it had ended its first tournament - with a surprise. Salve, in only its second year of varsity competition, supplied the upset last week in the tourney opener at McCoy Stadium, trouncing Barrington College 11-0.

The result was not as much a surprise as was the authority with which Salve did it. Steve Duda fired a three-hitter with 14 strikeouts. His teammates knocked out 12 hits, with Ken Findlay getting three. Cliff Carney added two hits and two runs batted in and Bob Ford also had two hits, both doubles.
