NORTHEAST REHABILITATION ASSOCIATION NAMES ROBERT J. MCKENNA OUTSTANDING LEGISLATOR OF THE YEAR

State Senator Robert J. McKenna was named Outstanding Legislator of the Year by the Northeast Rehabilitation Association (NERA) at its 1982 awards banquet held Thursday, May 27 in Bretton Woods, New Hampshire.

Senator McKenna was named this year's recipient for his sponsorship of legislation for the independent living program for handicapped individuals, and more specifically, for his work on the Personal Care Attendant (PCA) program.

Earlier this year, Senator McKenna was named the Outstanding Rhode Island Legislator of the Year by the Rhode Island Rehabilitation Association. Again, this award was made in recognition of his legislative leadership and achievement in facilitating rehabilitation opportunities for the disabled.

This will be the third award Senator McKenna has received in the last two years for his work in this area. In 1980 he received the Hubert H. Humphrey award from the Rhode Island Handicapped Action Committee for his work on PCA legislation.
