THOMAS FLANAGAN APPOINTED TO NEW ADMINISTRATIVE POSITION

Thomas P. Flanagan has been appointed director of administration in academic and student service areas at Salve Regina - The Newport College, it was announced today by Sister Lucille McKillop, College President.

Prior to joining the Salve administration, Mr. Flanagan was professor of management and executive assistant to the chairman of the management department at the Naval War College. In addition to teaching executive-level decision-making seminars at the War College, Flanagan was responsible for the management department budgeting and academic scheduling.

Mr. Flanagan, a Newport resident and retired U.S. Army Colonel, holds a bachelor of science degree in public relations and a masters degree in education from Boston University. His military career spans 22 years and includes specialized service in the areas of personnel administration, logistics research and management, manpower training and administrative support.

Mr. Flanagan's new responsibilities as a full-time administrator at Salve include budgeting management in academic and student service areas, personnel (non-faculty) development, management of College manuals, statistical reports and development of new academic programs, assisting with the College's transition to computerized record-keeping, and liaison services between the office of the College provost and other administrative and academic areas.
