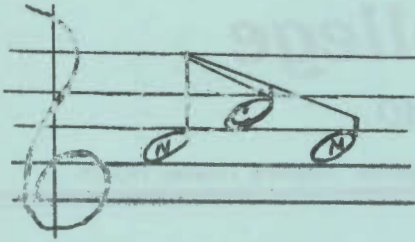

FORMER RESIDENT HALL DIRECTOR TO TEACH IN BELIZE

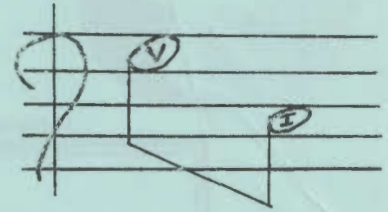

STUDENTS IN EDUCATION AND SPECIAL EDUCATION

Students planning to apply for Observation-Practicum or Student Teaching in Elementary or Secondary Education, Special Education, or Art Education must complete their applications on or before Friday, Sept. 24, 1982 at 12:00 noon. Application forms for Elementary and Secondary Education may be picked up at the bulletin board outside Sr. Corinne's office in Angelus Hall (Room 205); for Special Education, outside Sr. Kathryn's office in Angelus Hall, Room 206; for Art Education, students should see Mr. Jay Lacouture. The applications should be completed and returned on or before September 24th to Sr. Corinne, Sr. Kathryn, or Mr. Lacouture.

ANNUAL COMPETITION FOR OVERSEAS STUDY TO CLOSE SOON

The 1983-84 competition for grants for graduate study abroad offered under the Fulbright Program and by foreign governments, universities and private donors will close on October 31, 1982. Only a few more weeks remain in which qualified graduate students may apply for one of the approximately 500 awards which are available to 50 countries.

Most of the grants offered provide round-trip transportation, tuition and maintenance for one academic year; a few provide international travel only or a stipend intended as a partial grant-in-aid.

Applicants must be U.S. citizens at the time of application, and must generally hold a bachelor's degree or its equivalent before the beginning date of the grant and, in most cases, should be proficient in the language of the host country. Except for certain specific awards, candidates may not hold the Ph.D. at the time of application. Candidates for 1983-84 are ineligible for a grant to a country if they have been doing graduate work or conducting research in that country for six months or more during the academic year 1982-83.

Creative and performing artists are not required to have a bachelor's degree, but they must have four years of professional study or equivalent experience. Social work applicants must have at least two years of professional experience after the Master of Social Work degree; candidates in medicine must have an M.D. at the time of application.

Application forms and further information for students currently enrolled at Salve Regina College may be obtained from the Fulbright Program Advisor Miss Barbara Sylvia, who is located in Ochre Court (3rd floor). The deadline for filing applications on this campus is October 15.
