#### SALVE AWARDED FOGARTY FOUNDATION GRANT

Salve Regina - The Newport College has been awarded a \$15,000 grant by the John E. Fogarty Foundation for the mentally retarded to support the College's Continuing Education Center for Exceptional Adults. The award, announced recently by Joseph L. Byron, president of the Fogarty Foundation, will be used to support instruction and curriculum development.

Salve's Center for Exceptional Adults was initiated in 1974. In 1975 enrollment totaled sixteen students. This fall, more than 60 developmentally
disabled adults will participate in the Center's instructional program. Volunteer student teachers, most of whom are special education majors at Salve,
tutor adult participants in the acquisition of new skills or in the improvement
and strengthening of current skills. Instruction under the directorship of
Kathryn Rok, program director for the Center and instructor in the College's
special education department, takes place on a one-to-one basis.
