ADMISSIONS APPOINTMENTS

Five new appointments have been made recently in the Admissions Office. Elizabeth B. Vendittelli has been appointed Director of Admissions, and will be responsible for overall supervision and organization of the office.

Kathleen M. Horan and Thomas J. Lynch were promoted to Assistant Directors of Admissions. Kate, a Newport resident, has worked at Salve for the past two years as an Admissions Counselor. Her responsibilities include the coordination of the College's summer-tour program in Ochre Court and the college direct mail contact program for potential undergraduate and graduate students.

Mr. Lynch, with six years admissions experience, will be responsible for designing a comprehensive recruitment travel schedule and will work closely with members of the admissions staff regarding evaluation and selection of students entering the College directly from high school.

New to the Admissions Office are staff members Robert J. Hole, Admissions Counselor, and Anne M. Lynch, Admissions Officer. Mr. Hole, a graduate of St. Anselm's College, Manchester, N.H. and a Middletown resident, will represent the College in its student recruitment effort. Miss Lynch, a native of Newport, will also participate in the College's recruitment efforts, assist with student interviews, and will oversee the computerization of admissions data.

SOUTHERN AFRICA FORUM

"Southern Africa Forum" is the title of an October lecture series to be sponsored by the WORLD AFFAIRS COUNCIL OF RHODE ISLAND, the Council for International Studies of Brown University, and the Rhode Island Committee for the Humanities. This four-part series will focus on the historical, political, economic, religious, and cultural issues facing the countries of Namibia, Botswana, Zambia, South Africa, Zimbabwe, Mozambique, Malawi, and Angola. All lectures, which will be followed by open discussion, are free and the public is invited. They will begin at 7:30 p.m. in Alumnae Hall, 180 Meeting Street, Providence, on the campus of Brown University.

The first lecture will be October 4 - "Roots of Crisis" Leonard Thompson, Yale University historian, will be the speaker.
