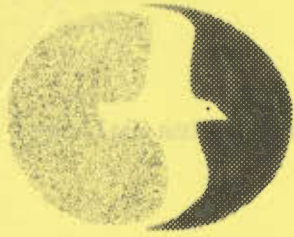

"TEACHING-ARTIST" IS THEME OF FACULTY ART SHOW; OPENING RECEPTION THIS SATURDAY

The opening reception for the Faculty Art Exhibition at the Cushing Gallery, The Art Association of Newport is Saturday, October 2, 5-7 p.m.

Exhibiting are Jay Lacouture, Richard Carbotti, Melvin Lieberman, Brother Ralph Bucci, Sister Arlene Woods, Angelo Marinosci, William Reis and Mark Sottnick.

According to Jay Lacouture, Chairman of Salve's Art Department, the theme of this diverse medium show is "artist-teacher or teaching-artist, an artistic illustration of how an individual views the experience of being both an artist and teacher."

At the opening reception film maker Mark Sottnick will show a recently produced 20-minute video piece, "Within Normal Limits." It explores the attitudes held by educators, physicians and parents who evaluate developmental testing and research on children.

The show continues through October 25, 1982. Gallery hours are Tuesday-Sunday from 1-5 p.m.
