Dr. Mary Louise Greeley recently had a research paper entitled "Benzo(a)Pyrene and Ascorbate-CuSO₄ Induce DNA Damage in Human Cells by Indirect Action" at an International Symposium on Cancer Research. This year's symposium was held at Uxbridge, England, in September. This research was supported by The Swiss National Science Foundation, and was a collaborative effort by Dr. Greeley, Dr. Peter Ceralt, Head of Carcinogenesis Research at The Swiss Institute for Experimental Cancer Research, and Dr. M. Kaneko also of The Swiss Cancer Institute. Dr. Greeley is the principal investigator.
