Three members of the Salve Regina College, Newport, faculty have received grants for summer graduate and post-graduate work, it was announced today by Sister Mary Hilda, R. S. M, president.

Sister Mary Philemon, R. S. M. , Chairman of the Division of Natural Science, has been awarded a grant by the Oak Ridge Institute of Nuclear Studies, Oak Ridge, Tennessee. Sister Mary Philemon, who teaches Chemistry at the College, will attend the Summer Institute in Modern Chemistry to be held in Oak Ridge from June 15 to August 7.

Dr. Ascanio G. Di Pippo, also a member of the College's Chemistry Department, will study in the field of organic mechanisms, under the direction of Dr. Bert M. Tolbert, at the University of Colorado, Boulder, Colorado. Dr. Di Pippo will spend the summer at the University of Colorado on a post-doctoral fellowship granted by the National Science Foundation. He teaches organic chemistry and bio-chemistry at Salve Regina and holds a Ph. D. degree from the University of Rhode Island, received in 1961. He resides with his wife and children at 115 Ellery Street, Providence, Rhode Island.
