HEALTH SERVICE SUMMER APPOINTMENTS

and Mrs. John V. Donnelly of 189 Garden Street, Fall River, Massachusetts, and a junior at Salve Regina College, Newport, R.I., has been selected for participation in the Army Dietetic Summer Practicum, July 6-31, 1964, it was announced by the College today.

The Dietetic Summer Practicum, con-

ducted by the Army Medical Specialist Corps, offers to selected students majoring in Foods and Nutrition or Institution Administration four weeks practical experience in hospital food service. The Practicum helps the student to understand the role of the dietitian as a member of both the medical and administrative team in the Army hospital, as well as something of the complexity of the hospital today.

Miss Donnelly is majoring in Nutrition at Salve Regina and upon the completion of her college work will be able to meet the requirements for the Dietetic Internship under the American Dietetic Association.

She will be assigned for the four-week period this summer to Valley Forge General Hospital, Phoenixville, Pennsylvania. This service incurs no military obligation as she will be classified as a temporary civil service "student employee."

At Salve Regina, Miss Donnelly is a day student; has served on the Student Council; is a member of the Home Economics Club, its secretary last year; is Vice President of the Junior Class; member of Sigma Phi Sigma, National Honor Society; and a member of the Commuters' Club. Miss Joan Gleckel, a Junior Nursing Education student at Salve Regina, has been given a U.S. Public Health Service appointment in Silver Spring, Maryland, as part of the Commissioned Officer Student Trainee Extern Program.
