"CONCERTS AT OCHRE COURT" HOSTS CANTILENA WIND QUINTET FEBRUARY 27

The Cantilena Wind Ouintet, professional free-lance musicians from the Boston and Providence areas, will perform chamber music for woodwinds by Haydn, Ravel, Arnold, Schuller and Berio on Sunday, February 27, at 2:00 p.m. The performance, is sponsored by the College and is partially funded by the Rhode Island State Council on the Arts through the New England Foundation for the Arts. It is the third of four "Concerts at Ochre Court" scheduled by the College for the 1982-83 year.

The Quintet's rich and varied repertoire extends across the entire spectrum of wind quintet literature, from the earliest quintets of the classical period to avant-garde works of the twentieth century. Of special note is the group's commitment to performing the music of women composers. The all-female Quintet has led the way in rediscovering neglected compositions of women composers of the past. Frequently, the Quintet presents new works by talented contemporary women composers.

Since their formation in 1975, the group has given more than 300 performances and has frequently appeared on National Public Radio's "Morning Pro Musica." The original building of the Great Ouaker Meeting House located on the corner of West Broadway and Marlborough streets, was built in 1699. Because it served as a regional meeting place for Quakers, its size continued to grow with Quaker membership. In the middle of the 18th century, approximately half of Newport's population were Quakers. Today, the Newport Historical Society owns the building and its restoration was completed in 1974.

Built more than 240 years after the Great Quaker Meeting House, the Martin Luther King Center on West Broadway served as a USO center for minority groups during World War II. Today the building houses a community center offering tutoring services, college preparation classes, recreation programs and a day-care center, among other services.
