Dr. Daniel Maguire, professor of Christian ethics in the theology department at Marquette University, Milwaukee, Wis., will present a lecture on "Technology and Justice," at 7 p.m. Thursday, March 24, in O'Hare Auditorium.

Dr. Maguire's lecture will focus on how the technological explosion is reshaping man's traditional search for justice. He will suggest that people have an obligation to come to terms with technology, adjust to the demands of technological breakthroughs, and begin once again to consider the human aspect, such as man's capacity to absorb change and challenge in today's increasingly complex world.
