



The Proposal for the change in the Sabbatical timeline be accepted by the Faculty Assembly for inclusion in the Faculty Manual.

1. Schedule for Sabbatical Applications and Process

The schedule for sabbatical applications and decisions may be summarized as follows, unless altered by the President or Provost. If one of the following dates falls on a day when University offices are closed, the deadline is moved to the next day when offices are open.

- May 1 Sabbaticals Committee (see Chapter X) elects its chair.
- Sept. 1— Deadline for sabbatical applications (see Appendix F), which are sent simultaneously to the Department Chair and the Provost.
- Sept. 15 By this date the Department Chair submits a report to the Provost, as described in D.1, below.
- Sept. 15- Sabbaticals Committee (see Chapter X) elects its chair.
- Sept. 30 The Provost submits all sabbatical documents, including the administrative commentaries described in D below, to the Sabbaticals Committee.
- Oct. 30 By this date the Chair of the Sabbaticals Committee, with any other committee members who are available, meets with the Provost to deliver its recommendation. The recommendation must also be submitted in writing, either in hard copy or electronically; indeed, at the Provost's discretion the required written report may obviate the need for a meeting.
- Nov. 15 By this date, the Provost submits all sabbatical materials and makes his or her own recommendations to the President.
- Dec. 15 By this date the President makes a decision on sabbaticals for the coming academic year.
- Jan. 15— By this date the Provost announces sabbatical recipients for the coming academic year.






