Jackson, who has assembled a panel of women managers from the worlds of business, education, and the military.

"MYTH IN THE AGE OF TECHNOLOGY"

Dr. Joseph Campbell, nationally known educator, scholar and author will speak on "Myth in the Age of Technology," at Salve Regina - The Newport College, Tuesday, April 26, at 7 p.m. The lecture will be held in O'Hare Academic Center. It is free and open to the public.

One facet of Campbell's lecture will be to examine archetypal images and the unconscious and how they connect with life in today's technological society. Archetypes, the original patterns or models from which things are made, appear in ancient religions, writings and works of art. It is suggested they reappear via the unconscious, thousands of years later in cultures such as our own.

Dr. Campbell is the author of numerous books about mythology including the five-volume series, "The Masks of God," which explores the great myths and legends in world history.

BISHOP REILLY TO SPEAK AT SALVE

Bishop Daniel Reilly, Bishop of the Diocese of Norwich, Connecticut, will speak on "Pacem In Terris: Twenty Years Later" on Thursday, April 28th. The lecture, being offered in conjunction with R.S. 222 - Christian Ethics and Contemporary Global Issues, will

be given at 7:00 p.m. in the T-B room in O'Hare Academic Center and is open to the entire college community. Bishop Reilly is a member of the committee that drafted the American Bishops' Pastoral Letter on Nuclear Disarmament.
