BISHOP DANIEL P. REILLY TO SPEAK THIS EVENING

Reverend Daniel P. Reilly, D.D., Bishop of the Diocese of Norwich, Connecticut, will speak on Thursday, April 28, at 7 p.m. The lecture

will be held in O'Hare Academic Center. It is free and open to all.

The topic of Bishop Reilly's lecture, "Pacem in Terris: Twenty Years Later," will reflect on the significance of Pope John XXIII's Encyclical on its twentieth anniversary. It will also address the pastoral letter expected in May from the American Catholic bishops regarding nuclear disarmament. Bishop Reilly, a member of the National Conference of Catholic Bishops' ad hoc Committee on War and Peace, was one of five American bishops responsible for drafting the nuclear disarmament statement.
