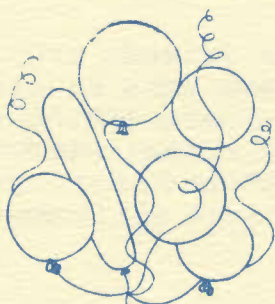

Dr. Mary Louise Greeley recently participated in a workshop on "A Multidisciplinary Approach to Fluids" which was sponsored by the American Society for Medical Technology, at Miriam Hospital in Providence, R.I. During this workshop the participants discussed the genesis of CSF (Cerebral Spinal Fluid), rapid identification of bacterial antigens in fluids, drugs and the blood-brain barrier, normal and abnormal cells in spinal and other fluids, cell counts and the cytopsin preparations.
