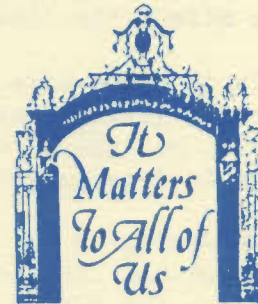

### A NEW GRADUATE PROGRAM

The threat of nuclear war, conflict in the Middle East and Olympic boycotts are all symptomatic of the stress and strain of global relations. What directions are chosen not only by the major powers but even the emerging nations may ultimately effect the lives of every American.

It is these directions in global affairs which are the focus of the recently instituted graduate program in International Relations at Salve Regina. Dr. Heath Twichell, an expert in the field, is director of the program which offers a Master of Arts in International Relations.

According to Dr. Twichell, "This is a program for people who want to know more about how the world really works, the nature of the international political structure; the forces, trends and ideas effecting it; who the actors are. But, beyond that, this is a program to help make the world a better place."
