To enhance the department's research, two department faculty, Sister Leona Misto and Sister Madeleine Gregoire, recently participated in a conference devoted to discrete mathematics and the recommendation to restructure the core curriculum for mathematics majors to include such a course in the first year of the program. The conference was sponsored by the New England region of the Mathematical Association of America.
