DR. WILSON BRYAN KEY TO LECTURE ON SUBLIMINAL SEDUCTION IN ADVERTISING

The Student Academic Senate at Salve Regina will sponsor a lecture by Dr. Wilson Bryan Key entitled, "The Subliminal Dimension," on Thursday, January 31 at 8:00 p.m. in the O'Hare Auditorium. The focus of the lecture will be subliminal seduction in advertising.

Author of the bestsellers, "Subliminal Seduction," "Media Sexploitation" and "The Clam-Plate Orgy," Dr. Key is a leading international authority on subliminal seduction in the advertising media. In his lecture he will explain the technology of mind manipulation and show slides of well-known advertisements which use subliminal manipulation to lure consumers.

Dr. Key holds a Ph.D. in Communication Studies and has lectured throughout the world on communication techniques and strategies. He has taught at the universities of Denver, Kansas, Boston, Puerto Rico and Western Ontario and has headed his own international research and business consulting group.

The McKillop Gallery will sponsor a Collegiate Drawing Invitational from February 21 through March 26, 1985. The juried exhibition is open to all undergraduate students in college and university art programs in Rhode Island and Southeastern Massachusetts.

Selection for the exhibition will be made from the actual works of art. Students may submit up to three drawings, no larger than 36"x36", in color or black and white. These drawings, which must be ready for installation, should be hand-delivered to the McKillop Gallery between the hours of 11:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, beginning January 21. Deadline for registration is Monday, February 4 at 4:00 p.m. A small registration fee will be charged.

Jurors for the exhibition will be Debra Johnson, curator of the Prints and Drawing Museum of Art, Rhode Island School of Design; Patricia Hurley, managing editor of "Drawing Magazine," New York City and William Francis Reis, artist/instructor of painting and drawing at Salve Regina. Cash awards will be presented to outstanding artists selected by the jurors.

Selected drawings will be exhibited at the McKillop Gallery from February 21 through March 26. An opening reception will be held on Thursday, February 21 from 7:30-9:30 p.m.
