ATWOOD LECTURE SERIES TO FEATURE REVEREND JAMES SKEHAN; GEOLOGY VS. THEOLOGY IS TOPIC

The Atwood Lecture Series will sponsor a lecture, "Is God a Creationist: Where do Geology and Theology Meet?", by Reverend James Skehan, S.J. on Wednesday, February 20 at 7:30 p.m. in the O'Hare Auditorium.

The lecture will concentrate on the Creationist theory of evolution vs. the scientific theory. Creationists deduce from the Bible that the earth is approximately 6,000 years old. According to geologists and their study of rock formations, the earth is at least 4,500 million years old. Father Skehan will discuss these differing opinions and whether the two can be reconciled so that people may simultaneously believe in both the Bible and science.

Reverend Skehan, Director of the Weston Observatory and the Department of Geology and Geophysics at Boston College since 1974, holds a Ph.L., S.T.B. and S.T.L. from Weston College and a Ph.D. in geology from Harvard University.

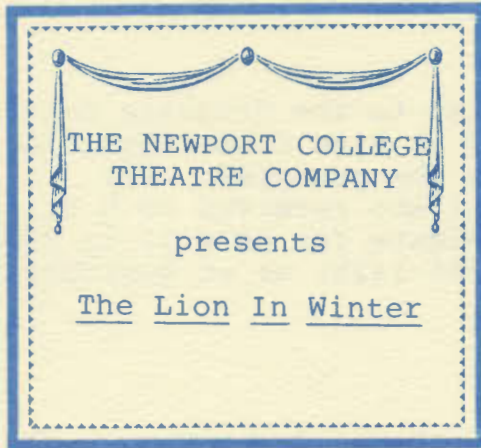
