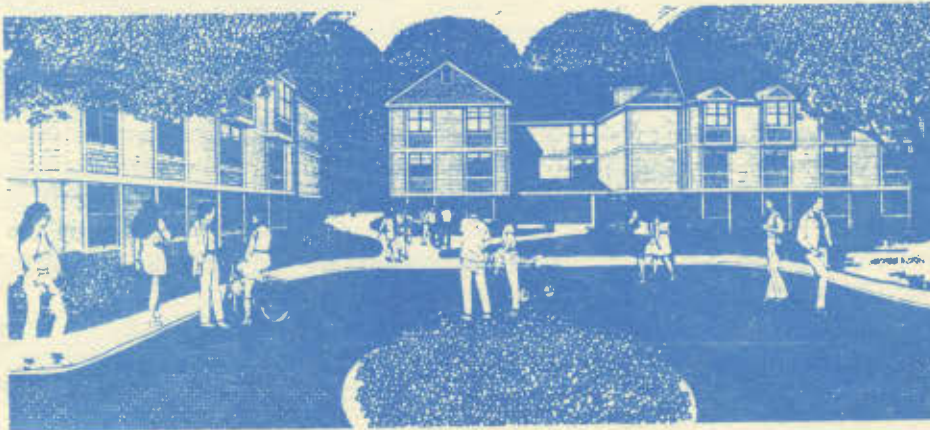

SALVE TO BREAK GROUND FOR NEW STUDENT RESIDENCE

On Monday, September 16 at 3:00 p.m. the Salve Regina College community is invited to attend the Groundbreaking Ceremony for the College's new student residence located at the intersection of Ochre Point and Victoria Avenues. A reception will follow in Ochre Court.

The building, designed by the Providence architectural firm of Robinson Green Beretta, will have two wings connected by a one-story structure. Carefully designed to be compatible with the surrounding environment, the building will be three stories, in keeping with the height of neighboring Moore Hall and other area houses. It will be situated among the site's abundant beech trees and rhododendrons. The exterior will consist of brick, clapboard and shingles giving the structure a residential rather than institutional appearance.

This new student residence is scheduled for completion in September of 1986 when it will open its doors to 146 Salve students.
