SALVE REGINA TO OFFER FIRST PERFORMANCE OF TRADITIONAL  
IRISH CONCERT SERIES; SEAN POTTS TO PERFORM

Salve Regina will present the first in a series of traditional Irish music concerts on Thursday, September 26 at 8:00 p.m. Sean Potts and Baker's Well will perform in Ochre Court.

Sean Potts, a former member of the Chieftains, is the foremost tin whistle player in the world. A Dubliner descended from a long line of noted folk musicians, Potts was a close friend and colleague of the great Sean O'Riada, the father of the Celtic music festival. Their collaboration on folk arrangements for Irish film scores ("Miss Eire, Saoirse?", Playboy of the Western World") led directly to the formation of O'Riada's "folk orchestra," Ceoltoiri Cualann, in 1961. The nine-member ensemble's concerts and recordings re-awakened public interest in Ireland's traditional music and folk instruments, just as the Clancy Brothers and Tommy Makem repopularized its native songs and ballads.

Shortly after O'Riada's death in 1971, Sean Potts, piper Paddy Maloney, and several fellow members of the Ceoltoiri Cualann formed the folk group whose name has become synonymous with Irish traditional music all over the world: the Chieftains.

Potts left the Chieftains in 1979 and now performs with Baker's Well, a unique ensemble like no other in Irish traditional folk music. The group's five members, who span five generations, consist of veteran performers Sean Potts on tin whistle and Mick Hand on flute. They are joined by three brilliant young musicians, Kevin Glackin on fiddle, harpist Noirin O'Donoghue and Sean Og Potts on

uilleann pipes.

Salve Regina will follow Potts' performance with two spring concerts in the Irish musical tradition. Seating for the concert is limited. For ticket information call extension 208.
