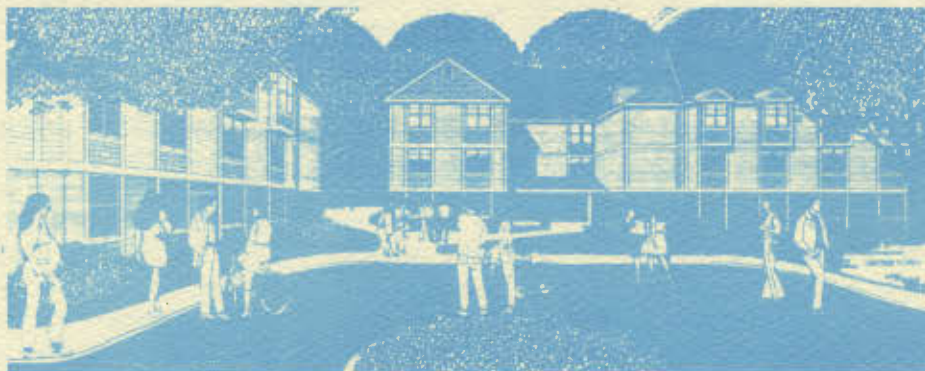

NEW STUDENT RESIDENCE

Salve Regina held a brief ceremony on Tuesday, September 2 to bless the new student residence which opened its doors to students for the first time on September 4.

The Most Reverend Louis E. Gelineau, a Salve Regina trustee, blessed the building at 6:00 p.m., following remarks by Salve President Sister Lucille McKillop, Vice President Sister M. Therese Antone and Andrew M. Hunt, chairman of the board of trustees.

Groundbreaking for the structure took place last September. The \$4 million residence hall is designed by Robinson Green Beretta, a Providence architectural firm. The residence is comprised of two three-story wings connected by a one-story structure and will house 146 students. The three-story height allows for compatibility with neighboring Moore Hall and other area houses. The exterior of the building consists of brick, clapboard and wooden shingles, giving a residential appearance rather than an institutional one. The residence hall rests among abundant, stately beech trees, rhododendron and other shrubs which have been left in place to maintain the site's attractiveness. Gilbane Building Company has served as the construction manager.

MCKILLOP GALLERY TO FEATURE
WORK OF NEW ART FACULTY

The McKillop Gallery at Salve Regina opened the academic year with an exhibition containing the work of two new art faculty members. The "New Faculty Exhibition" features paintings by Daniel T. Ludwig and photographs by John Willis from September 6-25.

Ludwig, newly-appointed, full-time instructor of art, holds a master of fine arts degree in painting from the University of Cincinnati and a bachelor of fine arts degree in sculpture from Rhode Island School of Design. He has exhibited his work extensively and is in several important private collections world-wide. He currently resides in Newport.

Willis has recently joined the College faculty as part-time instructor of art. He received his master of fine arts degree in photography from the Rhode Island School of Design and his bachelor of fine arts degree in photography and psychology from Evergreen State College, Olympia, Wash. In addition to extensive commercial and teaching experience, he has exhibited his work in numerous solo and group exhibitions across the country. His photographs have also appeared in several publications including "Solar Age Magazine," "Management Technology" and "Art Forum." Willis resides in Woonsocket, R.I.

The McKillop Gallery, located in Mercy Hall on the corner of Lawrence and Leroy Avenues, is open Monday through Thursday, 11:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. and Sunday from 2:00 to 4:00 p.m.
