ADULT EDUCATION PROGRAM

Salve Regina College will offer five courses in its second semester adult education program, starting February 8.

"Modern Mathematics for Teachers" will be taught by Sister Mary Ferrer, R. S. M., who is an exchange professor at Salve Regina for this year from St. Xavier College, Chicago, where she is professor of mathematics and a well known educational TV personality. This course will be offered on Wednesdays.

"Area Studies of The Non Western World," taught by Sister Mary Harold, R. S. M., answers in part the plea of educators and statesmen that schools and colleges stop concentrating solely on Western civilization, but extend their horizons world wide. This course will meet on Tuesdays.

Sister Mary Mercedes, R. S. M. ,
head of the College's Art Department will repeat "Art Education" which was offered
in first semester. She will also give the second semester of "History of Art,"
which will cover an entirely different period and may therefore be taken without
having had the first semester. "Art Education" will be taught on Mondays,
"History of Art" on Wednesdays.

"Creative Writing--Part II" will
be directed by Miss Mary Zavada, who joined the faculty of Salve Regina College
last September following work as a feature writer for United-Press International
in London and previously as a lecturer in creative writing and contemporary
literature at Trinity College in Washington, D. C. This class will meet on
Thursdays and will cover primarily the techniques of poetry and the short story.
It can be taken by those who did not have Part I in first semester.

Three semester hours of credit
will be granted for all courses. Registration in Angelus Hall on the campus will
take place during the week of February 8 before the first session of each course
from 3:30-4:00 p. m. Classes will meet regularly on the days indicated above
from 4:00-5:40 p. m. once a week.

Classes are open to men and women.

Credit is accepted by The Rhode Island Department of Education for certification renewal.
