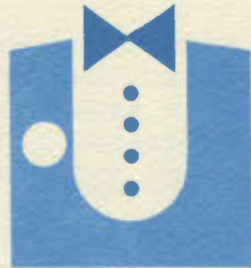

## DILEMMA OF NUCLEAR AGE SECURITY IS TOPIC OF SALVE REGINA/NEWPORT INSTITUTE CONFERENCE

Salve Regina, in cooperation with the Newport Institute, will present a conference, "The Dilemma of Security in the Nuclear Age: Can We Resolve It?," on Saturday, November 15. The conference will be held in O'Hare Academic Center from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. In addition, the Newport Institute will sponsor a "no-host" cocktail party at the Newport Tennis Hall of Fame, Bellevue Avenue, on Friday, November 14 from 6:00 to 7:00 p.m. Guest speakers from the conference will be in attendance.

The one-day conference is designed to examine the paradoxical dilemmas inherent in the security of the superpowers, and to explore new proposals that could reduce or eliminate the most unstable elements of the present "balance of terror." Three principal speakers will offer expert perspectives on the topic. The Honorable Thomas Graham, Jr., General Counsel for the U.S. Arms Control and Disarmament Agency, will discuss the current thinking of the Reagan administration on arms control with his topic, "Arms Control After Reykjavik."

Speaking for the loyal opposition will be Rear Admiral (Ret.) Eugene J. Carroll, Deputy Director of the Center for Defense Information. His topic will be "A New Concept for Security in the Nuclear Age."

A fresh approach to the current negotiating stalemate will be offered by the final guest speaker, Dr. Thomas H. Etzold, who will speak on "Emerging Concepts of Strategic Stability." Etzold is President of the Ivy Group, Inc., a Washington, D.C. consulting firm that specializes in the fields of energy, security and advanced technology. Moderating the conference will be Dr. James F. Tierney, Executive Director of the New York based Fund for Peace.
