SALVE REGINA COLLEGE ANNOUNCES \$10,000 GRANT
RECEIVED FOR ITS PROGRAM FOR TEACHERS OF MENTALLY RETARDED

Sister Mary Emily, R. S. M., president of
Salve Regina College, Newport, Rhode Island, today announced that the College had
received a grant of \$10,000 from Mr. Robert Goelet of Newport and New York City, to
be used in developing the College's Program for Teachers of the Mentally Retarded.

It was Mr. Goelet and his wife who gave
their estate, "Ochre Court," to Salve Regina College in 1947, making the founding of the
College possible that year.

Salve Regina launched its Program for
Teachers of the Mentally Retarded on June 29, 1964, with a one-week Intensive Survey
and a six-week Summer Workshop. These were conducted in cooperation with the
Newport School Department.

A second Workshop for Teachers of
Mentally Retarded, carrying six credits, has been scheduled for June 28-August 6 this
year, and plans are now being formulated for the 1965-66 academic year to continue and
enlarge this work.

Sister Mary Rosalia, R.S.M., Dean and
Chairman of the Community Service Division, is in charge of the new program.

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
