The Salve Regina College Women's Basketball Team coached by Lynn Sheedy and Laurie St. Jean, has won the Commonwealth Coastal Conference Championship. The Lady Newporters finished their conference season with an 11-1 record (17-6) overall which earned them undisputed possession of first place.

The Salve Regina College Club Hockey Team coached by Tom Farrea is the New England Small College Hockey Association Champion. Last Sunday, the hockey team dethroned defending New England Small College Hockey Association champion Clark University of Worcester, Mass., 4-3 in overtime at the Thayer Rink in Warwick. The Saturday before, the team, which was 13-8-1 in its fourth season, defeated the number two team in the tournament, the University of Hartford, 6-2.

Nicole Arabolos, a senior majoring in chemistry, has been awarded a full tuition scholarship to study for her Ph.D. in chemistry at Brown University. Nicole was also awarded a \$9,500 graduate teaching assistantship by the Brown University graduate school. The assistantship is renewable annually until she completes her doctoral studies.

During her junior year at Salve, Nicole was honored by the R.I. Section of the American Chemical Society as the outstanding student majoring in chemistry.

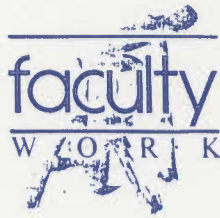
Carol LaSalle, a senior majoring in chemistry, has won a full tuition Fellowship to pursue doctoral studies in chemistry at Princeton University. The Fellowship also includes an annual stipend of \$10,000.

Carol was the recipient of the Alvin D. Fuller Junior Research Fellowship of the American Cancer Society during her junior year. She received a \$1,500 grant to do cancer research under the direction of Joel Greenberger, M.D. at the University of Massachusetts Medical Center in Worcester, Mass. She will also be honored as the outstanding senior chemistry student, by the American Institute of Chemists at a dinner to be held in April in Boston.

FACULTY NEWS

Sister Lucille McKillop, President, recently spoke at the Pawtucket Public Library on "Occupied Ireland - Why?" The lecture was part of the library's series "Ireland & Her People," cosponsored by the Rhode Island Heritage Commission, the Irish Sub-Committee and the American/Irish Cultural Exchange Commission.

Dr. Heath Twichell, Associate Professor of International Relations, recently gave a talk entitled: "American Foreign Policy at the Close of the Reagan Era: Where Do We Go From Here?" as part of a Winter Lecture Series for residents of Martha's Vineyard sponsored by The Nathan Mayhew Seminars. The talk took place before an audience of fifty people on the campus of The Seminars in Vineyard Haven, Massachusetts.

Michael Thombs, Assistant Professor of Information Systems Science, recently attended the Florida Instructional Computing Conference (FICC). He also published an interactive marketing diskette for Nova University. The Diskette contains an online college catalog listing all graduate degree programs for the University. The diskettes were distributed at the FICC exhibit hall and at sessions that dealt with new marketing strategies and technology. Some 3000 diskettes have been published.

Dr. Jorn Zeuge, Mathematics Department, and Dr. Michael DiMaio, Liberal Studies Department, have recently had accepted for publication an article entitled "Ambiguitas Constantiniana the Caeleste Signum Dei Constantine the Great." It will be published, by Byzantion: Revue Internationale des Etudes Byzantines in late 1988. Additionally, Dr. DiMaio has had an article, entitled "Smoke in the Wind: Zonaras' use of Philostorgius, Zosimus, John of Antioch, and John of Rhodes in his narrative on the Neo-Flavian Emperors." accepted for publication in the same journal.
