Symposium on "The World of the 21st Century"

On Saturday, April 9, the Trimester Graduate Program of Salve Regina College will present a symposium entitled: "The World of the 21st Century: What's Ahead for the United States?" The purpose of the symposium is to examine present trends and future possibilities in the economic position and military security of the United States in the world of the next century.

Offering their prognostications on this challenging topic will be experts in three different fields: Mr. Martin Gerra, Chief Economist for the IBM Corporation; Mr. Stephen Fought, a recognized authority on U.S.-Soviet strategic issues and a member of the Naval War College faculty; and Harvard's Dr. Mark Kramer, a participant in the "Alternative Futures" project sponsored by the Center for Foreign Policy Development of Brown University.

College Saving Initiatives

Faced with steadily rising college costs, the reduction of federal grants, and the difficulty of saving for tuition, families look to state government to offer plans that will ensure college opportunities for their children.

A special Rhode Island legislative commission prepared a comprehensive report that projects tuition costs in line with the scale of family income required. After reviewing public policy and examining the range of student aid programs available, the commission recommended the programs that would be realistic and workable for the different levels of family income. General Treasurer Begin will review this interesting report and explain the tuition plans/recommendations that represent a fresh approach to the current problem of financing higher education.
