**SALVE REGINA COLLEGE PROFESSORS
RECEIVE SCIENCE GRANTS**

Sister Mary Philemon, R. S. M.,
Chairman of Division of Natural Science at Salve Regina College, has been awarded a
National Science Foundation grant which will allow her to participate in the Summer Program
in Instrumental Methods of Analysis for College Teachers at Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute,
Troy, New York, June 21--August 13.

Sister Mary Philemon will be one
of 16 college teachers who will be given an intensive lecture and laboratory courses in
Instrumental Analysis. Upon completion of this course, these teachers will participate
in a six-week research program enabling them to become more familiar with newer
research techniques in some particular area of Instrumental Analysis.

Dr. Ascanio DiPippo, another
member of the Chemistry Department at Salve Regina College, will continue his post-doctoral
studies at the University of Colorado, Boulder, also under National Science Foundation
auspices. This is the second summer that Dr. DiPippo has received such a grant to pursue
his study in the field of organic mechanisms.
