SALVE REGINA COLLEGE PROFESSOR
ACTIVE IN NATIONAL CONVENTION

Dr. E. William Burrell, a member of the English Department and director of secondary education at Salve Regina College, is participating in the annual convention of the National Council of Teachers of English in Boston, November 25-27, with pre-convention workshops November 22-24.

Dr. Burrell has been a director of the National Council for five years and is currently President of the Rhode Island Council of Teachers of English, one of the hosts of the convention. During the convention, he will be chairman of a new committee on the History of English Teaching. Members of this committee represent the University of Wisconsin; University of Illinois; Indiana State University; Lexington, Massachusetts, High School; and Harvard University.

Mrs. Mary Davis of the faculty of Rogers High School, Newport, is the Associate Chairman of a pre-convention workshop on the Teaching of Reading.
